Why are we carrying out this work?

As part of our commitment to the environment and safety we'll shortly begin the final phase of our pine removal scheme along the A30 in Devon. We will remove pines in a series of phases between Lifton and Exeter (Alphington roundabout) and where appropriate replace with indigenous species including Hazel and Hawthorn. This will improve biodiversity, encourage local flora and fauna to naturally regenerate and enhance the landscape. The native trees will provide enhanced low-level screening upon maturity. Removing pines will also bring safety benefits as they are prone to toppling in high winds.

Works

Where possible work will take place during the daytime Monday to Friday. However, for some locations we'll need to work overnight, 8pm to 6am the following morning, when traffic flows are at their lowest. When working overnight we'll endeavour to complete all noisiest works before 11pm and where possible we'll use tree shears to minimise noise. We anticipate each plot will take an average of 2 – 3 shifts to complete. Please accept our apologies in advance for any inconvenience which may be caused.

Traffic management

Most works will be carried out under rolling lane closure and it may be necessary to close some laybys whilst works take place.
