164 RESOLUTION TO BORROW

On the proposition of Cllr S Firth and seconded by Cllr Jewell it was unanimously **RESOLVED** to seek the approval of the Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities to apply for a PWLB loan of £44,000 over the borrowing term of 15 years for the purchase of the field next to the Village Hall. The annual loan repayments will come to around £4115 a year.

It is not intended to increase the council tax precept for the purpose of the loan repayments for the year 2024-25.

It is also intended to increase the council tax precept for the purpose of the loan repayments in the year 2025-26 by a maximum of 44.41% which is the equivalent of an additional £24.49 a year. Donations from parish events and any budgetary underspend will reduce the amount needed to put the council tax up by.
